## ABOUT THE OSMANIA UNIVERSITY

The Osmania University, established in 1918, is the seventh oldest in the country, third oldest in South India and the first to be established in the Princely State of Hyderabad. Though the need for a university for the Hyderabad State was felt, both by the intelligentsia and the people for a long time, the initiative came from a civil servant, Sir Akbar Hydari, who was then the Home Secretary to the State Government. Sir Hydari, in a Memorandum to the Education Minister in early 1917, emphasized the need to establish a University for Hyderabad with 'Urdu' as the medium of instruction "as it was the language of the widest currency in India, official language of the State, and it is a language which is understood by a vast majority of the population of the State" He believed that higher education must have its foundations deep in national consciousness.

The propitious moment, however, came a few months later on 26th April 1917 when a **Firman** was issued for the establishment of the University. The **Firman** also detailed the 'Mission ' and 'Objectives' of the University to be that:

- The ancient and modern, the oriental and occidental arts and sciences are synthesized in such a manner that the defects of the present system of education are rectified.
- The ancient as well as modern methods of physical, intellectual and spiritual education are to be fully utilized along with an effort for the propagation of knowledge, the moral improvement of the students is regulated on the one hand, and research work of a high order in all branches of knowledge is conducted on the other hand.

Though the medium of instruction of the University was 'Urdu' an Aryan language that has direct Kinship with other languages of the country, instruction of English, as a language, was made compulsory for each student.

One of the basic ideals of Osmania University is to achieve an intellectual synthesis of oriental and occidental learning of the best that has been thought of and said, both in the East and in the West. Further, it aims at a cultural synthesis (as reflected in its architectural variety), the development of a national ethos, and the creation of an academic and social environment in which 'National Integration' is not a nebulous idea but a tangible reality.

## VISION OF THE UNIVERSITY

The Vision of the University is to generate and disseminate knowledge through a harmonious blend of ancient and modern wisdom, and to serve the society by developing in students heightened intellectual, cultural, ethical and humane sensitivities; to foster a scientific temper, and to promote professional and technological expertise.

## **ABOUT THE PROF. G RAM REDDY CENTRE FOR DISTANCE EDUCATION, OSMANIA UNIVERSITY (PGRCDE)**

The PGRCDE was established in the year 1977. Ever since the Osmania University established the Centre for Distance Education, the Centre has witnessed phenomenal growth and emerged as a pioneering institution in the field of Distance Education, with Potential for Excellence. The Centre has been named after Prof. G. Ram Reddy who was the doyen of Distance Learning in India and also the Vice Chancellor of Osmania University for two terms. He was the founding Vice Chancellor of first Open University in India in 1982, then known as Andhra Pradesh Open University (Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Open University) and Indira Gandhi National Open University. (IGNOU), Vice President of the Commonwealth of Learning (COL) Vancour, Canada, apart from being the Chairman of UGC and Chairman of the Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR).

To unlock the potential of individuals and leave a lasting impact on the world through the transformative power of education and research with the motto of "EDUCATION FOR ALL" and "EDUCATION AT DOORSTEP".

### **THE MISSION**

- To ensure the quality of programmes being offered in open and distance learning mode and online mode;
- To provide flexible learning opportunities not only through face-to-face interaction between the teacher and learner but also by using internet, e-learning materials and full-fledged programme delivery using technology assisted mechanism and resources;
- To keep track of delivery of e-learning programmes, learner's engagement, assessment, results, reporting and other related details in one centralised location;

This is found to be well received from student target groups. The Distance Education mode with interactive learning system at the core is the need of the day.

**PURSuing OF TWO ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES SIMULTANEOUSLY :** A Student pursuing Regular UG / PG course either in Osmania University or Other Universities may join any of the Distance / ODL courses offered by PGRRCDE, O.U. with effect from the academic Year 2023-2024 as per the guidelines issued by the UGC, New Delhi in April 2022 and the Guidelines approved by the Osmania University in the meeting of the Standing Committee of the Academic Senate held on 20<sup>th</sup> May 2023 (available on the website of PGRRCDE, O.U.)

### **LIBRARY FACILITIES:**

The Centre for Distance Education provides excellent study facilities to assist students learning. The CDE library is located at its campus .About 24,480 reference books are available in the Library beside Course materials, (prescribed, suggested and additional), audio – visual material and journals are available in the library. 7 Weekly & Monthly journals and 7 Daily News Paper are also available in the library and one e-library with 10 computer systems with internet facility.

  20. Every candidate once admitted shall have to pay the tuition fee for the whole year and in each semester as prescribed. If the candidate desires to discontinue the course and obtain the Transfer Certificate in the middle of the academic year or in subsequent years, he/she has to pay the fee for the whole year / semester as the case may be.
  21. Late fee will be charged after the due date of payment of Tuition fee.
  22. The Examination fees have to be paid by the candidates as and when the notification is issued for the payment of Exam fee for various courses. **Late fee will be charged after the due date of payment of Examination fee.**
  23. Annual examinations normally will be held during June / July. Semester Examinations are normally held in the month of May (I & III semester) and September (II & IV Semesters).
  24. For Graduate courses (BA/B.Com. /BBA) the examinations are conducted along with the regular course.
  25. For all legal matters the jurisdiction is restricted to Hyderabad City only.

26. Candidates are advised to be very clear in the choice of their course at the time of admission. Choice of course of study once made, will be final and NO change of subject will be entertained.
27. According to the norms of the University, a candidate who completes his Degree in Supplementary Examinations will **NOT** be eligible for admissions in PG course in the same academic year.
28. The students of the PGRRCDE are not eligible for bus pass facility & Hostel Accommodation. Further, that they are also not eligible for any other Scholarship from Govt. / University.
29. Candidates who have studied a part of their course through PGRRCDE will not be permitted to seek admission to the regular college under the jurisdiction of the Osmania University.

**GENERAL ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA**

1. There is no age restriction for admission to any course.
2. Candidates will be admitted without any Entrance Test provided the candidate fulfils the requisite qualifying conditions mentioned for the course. (Except MBA & MCA courses for which entrance requirement is prescribed).
3. The PGRRCDE, OU offers the ODL courses strictly in accordance with the norms of UGC (ODL) Regulations 2020 regarding the territorial jurisdiction.
4. Candidates from abroad are also eligible for admission to all courses provided:
  - a. They fulfill the requisite qualifying conditions mentioned in the prospectus.
  - b. They furnish an address and local phone number in INDIA for correspondence and dispatch of study material and information.
  - c. PGRRCDE does not entertain any correspondence on foreign address.
  - d. They should come to Hyderabad for writing the examinations till they complete the course (unless permitted to write online).
5. Candidates who have passed the qualifying examination conducted by the Board / University which are under the jurisdictional area of other States shall have to obtain an “**Equivalency Certificate**” from the Deputy Registrar (Academic), Osmania University to the effect that they are eligible for admission into the university courses.

### DIRECT ADMISSION TO SECOND YEAR

The following categories of P.G. students are only eligible for direct admission to the second year of the two years courses.

- i) A Post Graduate candidate who withdraws from a regular college of the Osmania University after completion of her/his first year (I & II semesters) can seek admission directly to the second year (III semester) with due permission from the Registrar (Academic), O.U.
- ii) Students of the Osmania University with a back-log of subjects in one or two or even all papers (i. e. both promoted and failed students) in the first year (after completion of course study of the first two semesters) will also be admitted directly to the second year (III semester) with due permission from the Registrar (Academic), OU

### VERIFICATION OF ORIGINAL CERTIFICATES:

After the registration the students are required to approach the PGRR Centre for Distance Education, Osmania University Campus or nearest study Center for the Certificates

verification. Students are required to submit all their original certificates for verification. The following certificates are essential to take admission in P.G. course:

1. Original Memo of Marks of Qualifying examination (BA/B.Com./B.Sc./B.Tech/ B.E.Degree Examination)
2. Transfer Certificate in original from the college last studied (Not returnable) (In case of a candidate pursuing two degree programmes simultaneously i.e., one in regular mode and the other through PGRRCDE, he/she has to submit the TC in original in primary course and a photocopy thereof in the secondary course. See O.U. Guidelines for further details)
3. Original Degree Provisional/ Convocation Certificate.
4. Original S.S.C. and Intermediate certificates.
5. SC/ST/BC/PHC certificates (If applicable)
6. **Migration Certificate** is to be submitted in original (not returnable), in case the candidate has passed the qualifying Examination from Universities in India, other than Osmania University along with a fee for **Rs.125/-**. A candidate who fails to submit Migration Certificate (as some of the Universities are not issuing Migration certificate) will be charged a fee of **Rs. 425/— in lieu of Migration Certificate**.

### STUDY MATERIAL

The Self- Instructional study/ course material will be provided for all papers. The students who take admission in person can collect the material in person by showing the fee receipt and Identity card from the study material section of the centre. The material will be sent by post depending on the mode of payment of their tuition fee and availability of such material.

### CONTACT CLASSES:

Contact between teachers and the taught will be provided by arranging the Contact cum-counseling classes for a period of 10 to 15 days at the end of the academic year/semester and prior to the semester/Annual Examinations as the case may be. Students should produce their identity card for attending these classes. No Hostel / boarding arrangements will be made by the Centre and the students have to make their own arrangements for staying in Hyderabad / District study centers for attending these contact classes

**PSYCHOLOGY PRACTICAL CLASSES:**The Practical classes will be conducted at PGRRCDE, O.U. Campus, Hyderabad, for M.A. Psychology I & II year prior to the Annual/ semester Examinations. **It is compulsory for all the students to attend these practical classes conducted for 5 days.**

**NOTE:** The students of the courses having Practical Examinations have to pay the fee of Rs.500/- (per year) in addition to the normal Exam fee.

### COMPULSORY FOR M.A. PSYCHOLOGY

Attending all Practical classes in a batch in which the candidate is included, is compulsory for appearing in M.A. Psychology (Pre) (Paper-V) and M.A. Psychology (Final) (Paper-V) Practical Examinations

Attending theory - cum - experimental learning contact classes of M.A. Psychology (Final) Elective Papers [III A and IV A (or) III B and IV B] is compulsory for appearing in theory exams in the papers concerned.

## EXAMINATIONS

### 1) RULES OF EXAMINATION:

Examination fee payment details can be obtained by the candidates through PGRRRCDE website: [www.oucde.net](http://www.oucde.net)

**NOTE:** The students of the courses having Practical Examinations have to pay the fee of Rs.500/- (per year / Semester) in addition to the normal Exam fee.

### 2) SCHEME OF THE EXAMINATION:

- There is no “detention” system in Distance Education. Students who have failed will be allowed to continue the course of study for the next year. with the following conditions.
- In case of PG courses, candidate have to complete the course in four academic years from the date of joining. Those who could not complete the course within four years, have to **Re-register** by paying Rs.500/- for every year. Those who have paid the examination fee both for previous and final year/semester but failed to appear/ appeared and failed only are eligible for “**Re-Registration**”.
- The candidates who have completed four years period from the year of Registration and have registered to M.A., M.Com., M.Sc. (Mathematics) and M.Sc. (Statistics) Previous examinations but not registered for Final year examinations, have to pay **Re-Registration fee of Rs. 1000/-** for permission to appear for their Final year exams in addition to the normal exam fee. Similar procedure has to be followed for the courses offered with semester system.
- Candidates who have completed four years period from the year of registration and paid term fee for previous year but not registered and paid exam fee for previous examinations, have to pay Rs.1000/ towards Re-Registration fee for permission to appear for the previous examinations, and they are eligible to write the final year examinations in the next academic year by paying Rs.500/- every year towards Re-Registration fee in addition to the normal examination fee. Similar procedure has to be followed for the courses offered with semester system.

Candidates appearing for P.G. Examinations should register first for PREVIOUS examinations. **They cannot appear for both Previous and Final Year examination simultaneously unless they register for PREVIOUS examination in the preceding year.**

### INTERNAL ASSIGNMENTS (IA) :

Every student of M.A./ M.Com./M.Sc. I & II Year (all the Four semesters) who have paid Examination Fee for the First time only have to write and submit Assignment for each paper compulsorily for that Year / Semester. Each assignment carries 20 / 30 marks as per the scheme and syllabus. University Examinations will be held for 80 / 70 marks as per the scheme and syllabus. The concerned faculty evaluates these assignment scripts. The marks awarded to the Candidates will be forwarded to the Controller of Examination, for inclusion in the University Examination marks. If Candidate fails to submit Internal Assignments before the stipulated date, the internal marks will not be added to University examination marks under any circumstances. The assignment marks will not be accepted after the stipulated date. Internal Assignment should be submitted only when examination fee is paid for the first time.

Students have to pay Rs. 300/- towards Internal Assignment Fee along with the Examination Fee prescribed and submit the Online Fee Receipt / Acknowledgement along with assignments at the concerned counter before stipulated date and obtain proper receipt.

**Assignments on Printed / Photocopy / Typed papers will not be accepted and will not be evaluated at any cost. Only hand written Assignments (with blue pen) will be accepted and evaluated.**

## **RULES FOR IMPROVEMENT:**

### **PAPER-WISE IMPROVEMENT:**

Paper-Wise improvement is permissible either in the individual paper or in the whole of an examination, only when he / she has passed in the first attempt, conducted by the University for that batch of Regular students admitted to the course along with him/her.

- i. Candidates are permitted to appear for paper-wise improvement only once for year / semester wise examination.
- ii. Candidate who wishes to improve his / her performance, in any year / semester wise examination is required to do so by appearing in the next immediate regular examination, along with the next batch of regular students, conducted by the University. Even if a student has passed in one or two or three papers in the previous or final year / semester wise in their first attempt, can appear for paper-wise improvement along with backlogs (i.e., along with failed papers) in the next immediate examination. Paper-wise improvement is not permissible on completion of any backlog papers.

**Note:** Backlog means those who have registered for the examination but absent in one or more papers, or failed in any paper or not registered for the examination along with his/ her batch of students.

- iii. Candidates appearing for paper-wise improvement are permitted to retain the better of the two performances (marks) in individual papers, for the purpose of award of division.

### **AGGREGATE IMPROVEMENT:**

When the Candidates exhausted the chances of paper-wise improvement in any year / semester, they shall be permitted to appear for aggregate improvement as per the following conditions.

- i) The aggregate improvement is permissible only if he / she appears for the whole examination and not in individual papers. The candidate can appear either for previous or final or for both under year-wise scheme of examination or semester-wise scheme as applicable. The candidates have to appear for improvement examinations as per the scheme and syllabus in vogue at the time of taking the examination.
- ii) When the candidate appears for the whole examination either under year-wise or semester-wise scheme (as applicable) for aggregate improvement, he/ she shall have the OPTION to retain the better of the aggregate marks of the two examinations taken as a whole and not the better performance in individual paper(s).  
Further, the candidate is allowed to appear for aggregate improvement either in previous or final or both but not exceeding (2) chances in previous or final year each. The same shall be applicable to the Semester- wise system.
- iii) Candidates who appear for improvement of performance under the above two categories are not eligible for the award of Distinction/ Prizes/ Merit Certificates etc.

**Note:** These rules for improvement may change from time to time. The candidates are advised to seek clarification from the concerned counter of PGRRCDE and also from the Examination branch of the Osmania University.

## ENROLMENT NUMBER AND IDENTITY CARD

- Every candidate who is admitted to the PGRR Centre for Distance Education will be assigned an Enrolment Number which will hold good during the entire period of the course. ## **MASTER OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (MBA) COURSE**

### **(A) GENERAL ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA**

1. There is no age restriction for admission to MBA Course.
2. Candidates who have passed the qualifying examination conducted by the Board / University which are under the jurisdictional area of other States shall have to obtain an Equivalency Certificate from the Deputy Registrar (Academic), Osmania University to the effect that they are eligible for admission into the university courses.

### **(B) ELIGIBILITY:**

Any Graduate (10+2+3 or 10+2+4 or 10+3+3 pattern) with 50% marks ( 45% marks for BC/ SC/ST candidates)

1. A Candidate should Qualify in the Current year TS –ICET or AP - ICET (Integrated Common Entrance Test for MBA/ MCA) / OU Eligibility Test (conducted by OU for admissions into MBA / MCA of OU)
2. A pass in S.S.C is mandatory.

### **(C) TRANSFER OF STUDENTS:**

Transfer of students from Regular college to PGRRCDE in MBA/ MCA is allowed with due permission of the Dy. Registrar, (Academic), OU. However, there is no transfer of M.B.A. students of PGRRCDE to regular college.

### **(D) DURATION OF THE COURSE:**

Two academic Years (Four Semesters) for MBA

### **(E) FEE DETAILS:**

MBA- Two Years (IV Semesters) Rs. 10,000/- per each Semester

Study material in full will be issued to those who have paid the full fee

## (G) ENCLOSURES FOR EXAMINATION ONLINE APPLICATION FORM

The following documents must be attached with the examination Online application form.

- (I) **Migration Certificate** should be submitted in original (NOT Returnable) in case the candidate has passed the qualifying Examination from Universities in India, other than Osmania University. A candidate who fails to submit Migration Certificate (where the Universities are not issuing Migration certificate) will be charged a fee of Rs. 425/- in lieu of Migration Certificate.

## (H) MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION AND STUDY MATERIAL

The medium of instruction and the Study material for M.B.A. is offered only in English Medium.

## (I) METHOD OF INSTRUCTION

### 1. STUDY MATERIAL

The material is normally dispatched to the students in one or two installments. The students who take admission in person can collect the material in person by showing the online fee receipt and Identity Card from the material section of the centre.

### 2. CONTACT PROGRAMME:

Contact between teachers and the taught will be provided by arranging the Contact cum-counseling classes on Second Saturdays and Sundays for M.B.A. students. The venue of the classes' exact dates and timings of the commencement of contact classes will be intimated to the candidates through SMS alerts to their Registered Mobile Number. Students should produce their identity card for attending these classes. No Hostel/ boarding arrangements will be made by the Centre and the students have to make their own arrangements for staying in Hyderabad.

## (J) INTERNAL ASSIGNMENTS :

Submission of Assignments is Compulsory for the Students of M.B.A. Each Candidate has to submit **Two Assignments** for each paper which carries 15 marks each before the stipulated date. Assignments should be **handwritten only**. Assignments on printed / Photo copy or on typed papers will not be accepted and will not be evaluated at any cost. Assignment question paper will be available online (**www.oucde.net**) before the commencement of Semester examination. Assignments will not be valued if candidate don't submit examination application form. Assignments will be evaluated by the faculty and marks secured will be added to the University Examination. This will be applicable to the candidates who have registered for the examinations for that particular year/ Semester only.

- b. However they have to complete the course in four academic years from the date of joining for two year Course. Those who could not complete the course within four years, have to re-register by paying Rs.1500/- every year in addition to the normal examination fee. Those who have paid the examination fee four years but failed to appear/appeared and failed only are eligible to “re-registration”. If not they could not take benefit of this they have to take fresh admission.
- c. The candidate who have completed FOUR YEARS period from the year of registration and not registered for MBA I, II, III, IV semester examination, have to pay re-registration fee of Rs. 3000/- in each semester for permission to appear for their semester wise examination in addition to normal exam fee.
- d. Semester wise Students have to complete the course in Four years, after they have to Re-Register by paying prescribed Re registration Fee.
- e. Those who have paid the examination fee for 1st year/semester are only eligible to pay II year/semester exam fee and those who have paid the exam fee for the I and II year/semester are only eligible to pay examination fee of III year/semester.

### RULES FOR IMPROVEMENT:

#### a) PAPER-WISE IMPROVEMENT:

Paper-wise improvement is permissible either in the individual paper or in the whole of an examination, only when he /she has passed the exams in the first attempt, conducted by the University for that batch of students admitted to that course along with him/her.

- i. Candidates are permitted to appear for paper-wise improvement only once for First Semester/ Second Semester examination under Semester-wise Scheme.
- ii. Candidate who wishes to improve his/ her performance (marks), either in the I, II, III and IV Semester examinations are required to do so by appearing in the next immediate regular examination, along with the next batch of students, conducted by the University. Even if a student has passed in one or two or three papers in the First, Second, Third and Fourth Semesters in their first attempt, can appear for paper-wise improvement along with backlogs (i.e., along with failed papers) in the next immediate examination. Paper-wise improvement is not permissible on completion of any backlog papers.

**NOTE:** Backlog means those who have registered for the examination but absent in one or more papers or failed in any paper.

- iii. Candidates appearing for paper-wise improvement are permitted to retain the better of the two performances (marks) in individual papers, for the purpose of award of division.

#### b) AGGREGATE IMPROVEMENT RULES :

When the Candidates exhausted the chances of paper-wise improvement for First, Second, Third and Fourth Semesters the candidates shall be permitted to appear for aggregate improvement as per the following conditions.

- i) The aggregate improvement is permissible only if he / she appear for the whole examination and not for individual papers. The candidate can appear either in First, Second, Third and Fourth Semesters under semester-wise scheme of examination. The candidates have to appear for improvement examinations as per the scheme and syllabus in vogue at the time of taking the examination.
- ii) When the candidate appears for the whole examination either in First, Second, Third and Fourth Semesters aggregate improvement, he/ she shall have the OPTION to

retain the better of the aggregate marks of the two examinations taken as a whole and not the better performance in individual paper (s).

Further, the candidate is allowed to appear for aggregate improvement either in First, Second, Third and Fourth Semesters but not exceeding (2) chances in each First, Second, Third and Fourth Semesters within the stipulated period of FOUR years after passing the First, Second, Third Fourth Semester examinations.

- iii) Candidates who appear for improvement of performance under the above two categories are not eligible for the award of Distinction/ Prizes/ Merit Certificates etc.

**NOTE: These rules for improvement may change from time to time.**

**GUIDELINES TO MBA STUDENTS FOR PROJECT REPORT**

For all professional courses it is compulsory to submit a Project Report. This is a worldwide practice aimed at preparing the students to get the taste of the real-time experience in the profession they have chosen to pursue.

Project work is aimed at preparing the MBA students in understanding the application value of the principles and paradigms they have studied as part of their Two - year Programme. The objective of project work is to offer them guidelines to select a topic of their choice or choice of the organization where they want to study in consultation with their project guide. If they follow these guidelines carefully the objective of preparing them for report writing will also be achieved because preparing reports is an essential activity of any business manager. The format for project report given to the students by the centre is universally accepted and if they follow this format carefully it will facilitate the examiner in the evaluation of this report which carries grades A to D. It may be noted that the candidate can also show their project report with confidence and pride to their prospective employers (Selectors):-

A managerial research is generally conducted to probe into a management problem resulting in a research report. It means that a research report is the end product of a research. On the other hand a business report or a management report is a report prepared by the management to portray certain important aspects or problems in business. Thus, two important types of report in the realm of management are: (1) business report or management report, and (2) managerial research report. Your project report could be any one of them or could be both if any organization requests you to study problems of their organization.

**METHODOLOGY**

Business research starts with report planning, which includes a determination of the objectives of the report, identification of the target reader of the report, consideration of the real purpose of the report, planning for the collection of proper materials for the report, preparation of the scheme of report writing, planning for proper utilization of time in report writing, and crystallization of the actual lay out of the report.

Once the report is planned, material collection starts. Checking and rechecking of materials collected against the actual objectives and layout of the report then become necessary.

Arranging the contents of the report should also not be forgotten. When the collected materials, data, observation, documentation, information, opinion, clarification, etc., are arranged and fitted together to a carefully articulated form, the writer will come to know as to which materials to put together in the report, and what is to be dispensed with. It should, however, be ensured that enough material has been selected to carry out the purpose of the report. When the prospective reader is less familiar with the situations and specifications than the writer, the writer must ensure that all the necessary details are given in the report. But the information must be to the point and in accordance with the needs of the reader. Beating about the bush must be avoided.

As soon as proper data and information are collected, selected, and arranged, adequate thought must be given to the purpose of the report that is: what is to be communicated? To whom it is to be communicated? When is to be communicated and for what purpose? Think over it, try to rearrange your materials, and then start writing the report. This will enable you to determine what should find a place in your report and where and what must not be included in it. It is the report writer who will have to decide about what is to be included in the report to make it effective. Generally speaking the following may be the contents of a report:

Index of key words used in the report

In table of contents an outline of the report, which contains major headings and subheadings, as well as the various sub - sections are presented. There should be a summary of the report, especially when the report runs into many pages. The summary provides a reasonably complete resume of the report. And it helps the reader to grasp what is important in the report. The body of the report is its chief part. It includes everything from the statement of

the problem to a detailed analysis of the data and information. Statistics, documentation, and information are presented for analytical purposes. Everything should be organized in an elegant manner. This should be followed by conclusions, suggestions and recommendations.

### **NATURE OF THE PROJECT**

The project work undertaken by the candidate may be:

- a) Either a case study of a problem or practices in an organization (S)
- b) Comparative study of two organizations or within an organization its performance during different periods.

It may be based either on primary data (data the student is collecting) or secondary data (data already available) or both (books/documents etc)

### **PROJECT SUPERVISOR/GUIDE**

The Project guide will be allotted by the Director, PGRRCDE, O U from among the following. Candidate should contact the concerned Project guide only between 10.00 am to 6.00 pm on phone:

- a) An Academic Counselor of PGRRCDE, O.U. OR
- b) A member of the Faculty of O.U. or its Affiliated Colleges.

### **SELECTION OF TOPIC**

A student can choose any topic of his/ her own choice. In case, the students want to work in areas like General Management, Production Management, Operations Research, MIS, TQM, etc. they can choose a topic from those areas after consulting their guides. But if the students want to work in specialization areas, viz, Finance, Marketing and Human Resource Management, then the area topic they are selecting for project work should correspond with the specialization area opted by them in their final year MBA Programme

### **SUBMISSION OF THE PROJECT PROPOSAL**

Students have to finalize the topic and synopsis (of not more than 5 typed pages) of the project in consultation with their Guide and send the same along with the duly completed Project Proposal Proforma (see

Annexure-II) in triplicate to the Director, PGRRCDE, O.U. HYD - 500 007. for approval.

The synopsis submitted by the candidate should be in the format enclosed (Annexure-II)

Before sending the Synopsis ensures that:

- It is in the paper format
- Project Proposal Proforma in triplicate duly signed by the Project Guide is enclosed. **(Annexure - I)**
- One self-addressed envelope is enclosed.

### **PREPARATION AND SUBMISSION OF PROJECT REPORT**

- a) The Project report may consist of 50 to 100 pages (including the appendices, exhibits etc.) depending on the scope of the topic.
- b) The candidate has to mention the research methodology he/she proposes to follow in the sample selection and collection of data.

- c) The report should be compulsorily be typed on the bond papers in double space.
- d) The Project Report fee should be paid Online only, along with IV Semester Exam fee.
- e) The project report should contain the following three certificates: they are:
  - i) The approval for the synopsis received from the PGRRCDE, O.U.
  - ii) Certification given by the Project Guide that the student worked under his / her **guidance (Annexure- IV)**
  - iii) Declaration by the student stating that the work is an original one and has not been submitted to any University or Institution for the fulfillment of the requirement of a course of study. Annexures IV have to be enclosed only to the final Project Report but not to the synopsis.
- (f) Synopsis received after the last date will not be accepted.
- (g) Submission of the project report is a pre-requisite for writing the final year examinations.
- (h) As the project report will not be returned to the students they are advised to keep one copy of the report for themselves.

### EVALUATION OF THE REPORT

The project report submitted by the candidates will be evaluated by an examiner other than guide.

### **B). ELIGIBILITY:**

## L) RULES FOR IMPROVEMENT:

### a). Paper- Wise Improvement

Paper-wise improvement is permissible either in the individual paper or in the whole of an examination, only when he /she has passed in the first attempt, conducted by the University for that batch of students admitted to the course long with him/her.

- i. Candidates are permitted to appear for paper-wise improvement only once for First year examination under year-wise scheme/ for semester wise scheme the rules are applicable as per university guidelines.
- ii. Candidate who wishes to improve his / her performance (Marks), whether in the I year or II year examinations conducted by the University is required to do so by appearing in the next immediate regular examination, along with the next batch of student. Even if a student has passed in one or two or three papers in the First and Second years in their first attempt, can appear for paper-wise improvement along with backlogs (i.e., along with failed papers) in the next immediate examination. Paper-wise improvement is not permissible on completion of any backlog papers. For semester wise scheme the rules are applicable as per university guide lines.
- iii. **Note: Backlog means those who have registered for the examination but absent in one or more papers or failed in any paper.**
- iv. Candidates appearing for paper-wise improvement are permitted to retain the better of the two performances (marks) in individual papers, for the purpose of award of division.

### b). Aggregate Improvement:

When the Candidates exhausted the chances of paper-wise improvement of First and Second years, the candidates shall be permitted to appear for aggregate improvement as per the following conditions. (For all semester wise scheme the rules are applicable as per the university guidelines).

- i). The aggregate improvement is permissible only if he / she appears for the whole examination and not in individual papers. The candidate can appear either for First, or Second or all the Two years under 4 Semester wise scheme of examination. The candidates have to appear for improvement examinations as per the scheme and syllabus in vogue at the time of taking the examination.
- ii) When the candidate appears for the whole examination either in First or Second years for two years aggregate improvement, he/ she shall have the OPTION to retain the better of the aggregate marks of the two examinations taken as a whole and not the better performance in individual paper (s)
- iii) Further, the candidate is allowed to appear for aggregate improvement either in First or Second for Three years but not exceeding (2) chances in each First and Second years, within the stipulated period after passing the first and second year examinations (For Year wise Scheme). For Semester wise Scheme the rules are applicable as per osmania university guidelines
- iv) Candidates who appear for improvement of performance (marks) under the above two categories are not eligible for the award of Distinction/ Prizes/ Merit Certificates etc.

**NOTE:** These rules for improvement may change from time to time. The candidates are advised to contact the examination section regarding the examinations and improvement for correct/ updated details.

- Every candidate who is admitted to the Prof. G. Ram Reddy Centre for Distance Education will be assigned an Enrolment Number which will hold good during the entire period of the course. In all communications the student must invariably mention this enrolment number in full. Correspondence without enrolment number will cause delays and difficulties both to the Centre and the student and at times the Centre may not be in a position to respond. The Enrolment Number will also be used in the examination as Hall Ticket number.
- Every candidate admitted at the centre will also be supplied with an Identity Card by the Centre with the enrolment number. The blank Identity Card sent with the application form must be filled in and got attested at the time of admission. This card must be produced whenever required by the authorities at the time of Contact cum Counseling Session, University Examinations, and at Library. ### I) **Eligibility:**

- (i) Candidate shall be admitted to the three year B.A./B.Com./ B.B.A.(Degree) Course if he/she has passed Two Years Intermediate examination conducted by the Board of Intermediate, Government of Telangana or Higher Secondary Certificate examination (10 + 2 standard) or Pre-University Examination or any examination recognized as equivalent thereto.
- (ii) For **B.A. (Mathematics & Statistics)**, a candidate should have studied Mathematics or Statistics as one of the optional at Intermediate or its equivalent.
- (iii) A candidate who passed any Diploma course through Polytechnic Board of Telangana is eligible for admission into B.A./ B.Com./B.B.A. 1 year. However, **the ITI certificate holders are NOT eligible for admission into B.A./B.Com./B.B.A. 1 year.**
- (iv) A candidate who did 10+2 from National Open Schools or a diploma in any course from any polytechnic Board or 10+2 other than from Telangana should obtain equivalent certificate from Board of Intermediate Govt. of T.S., Hyderabad, to the effect that they are eligible for admission in to the University courses.

### II) **For Admission to the Second / Third Year of Degree Courses:**

- (i) A candidate who withdraws from a regular college of Osmania University after completion of his/her first year or second year can seek admission in second year or third year as the case may be, with due permission from the Deputy Registrar, (Academic), OU. The backlog papers should be cleared from the college where previously studied or PGRRCDE, in case of any difference paper it should be cleared from PGRRCDE.
- (ii) Students of Osmania University with a back-log of subjects in one or two or even all the papers (i.e., both promoted and failed students) in the first year or second year stage, will also be admitted directly to the second or third year of study, as the case may be. The back-log papers should be cleared from the PGRRCDE in the Supplementary or the following Annual Examination.

### III. **IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS FOR STUDENT ON BEING TRANSFERRED TO PGRRCDE**

The transferred students of Affiliated colleges of O.U. or other Universities seeking admission into II & III years of BA., B.Com., and BBA should compulsorily have to pass the following papers:

- (1) Indian Heritage and Culture & Fundamentals of Human Values and Professional Ethics in 1st year.
- (2) Environmental Studies in 2<sup>nd</sup> year
- (3) Science & Civilization in 3<sup>rd</sup> year and have to register for the above subjects with separate examination fee failing which their degree will not be issued. In both the above cases, admissions will be accorded, provided the combination of the group

subjects offered, Second Language offered and the medium of instruction offered to the candidate, in the regular college are the same as those offered in the Prof. G. Ram Reddy Centre for Distance Education. Those students who completed DCCP (3- years course) are eligible for admission into II year of B.Com. However, they have to clear the Five papers (what are 5 papers) mentioned in the orders issued by Dy. Registrar, Academic Branch, O.U.

- (4) A Post-Graduate / Honours Candidate / Graduate of Arts / Social Science / Science / Commerce of any University in India desirous of doing a Second degree course other than the one done by him / her earlier, can seek admission to the second year of BA/ B.Com. Course with exemption of language subjects with due permission from the Deputy Registrar (Academic Branch) O.U. Such a candidate will answer 1st and 2nd year group papers under the year-wise pattern at the end of the 2nd year and 3rd year stages of study. Part-I passed Regular students of B.A. / B.Com / B.Sc. of Osmania University will be admitted into the 2nd year of B.A. / B.Com. offered by PGRRCDE with exemption of Language subjects with due permission from the Deputy Registrar (Academic Branch) OU, Such candidates shall have to appear 1st and 2nd year optional papers under the year-wise pattern at the end of the 2nd year. They should pay Rs. 300-Online for language exemption.
- (5) Candidates who have discontinued their studies as students in regular colleges and are desirous of seeking admission into second or third year B.A. through PGRRCDE shall be permitted to offer one of the optional subjects not included in the approved combinations during private study. The candidate shall, however, pay an exemption fee of Rs.300/-through Online

## **RULES FOR IMPROVEMENT : (B.A., B.Com and BBA, B.A. (Maths and Statistics)**

### **a) IMPROVEMENT DURING THE STUDY OF THE COURSE.**

A candidate who has passed in all the papers of I / II year completely can improve his/her performance/marks in one or more papers of I / II year in the immediate next examination with provision to retain the better of the two results. A candidate after passing the III year examination completely can improve his performance/marks by appearing for all the papers of III year in the immediate next examination and can retain the better of the two results

### **IMPROVEMENT RULES AFTER COMPLETING THE COURSE:**

All such candidates who could not avail the improvement chances during the course of study as per the above rules, can avail the improvement chance after completion of the course as per the following procedure:

- (i) A candidate who has passed in the papers of Part-I examination shall be permitted to appear and pass all the subjects/ papers of Part-I after passing the degree course completely.
- (ii) A candidate who has completely passed the degree course shall be permitted to improve the performance/marks in Part-II by appearing for the papers of I year or II year or III year or all the papers of three years.

### GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

#### 1. Eligibility for Advanced Diploma Courses

There is no age restriction for admission. Candidates from **all over India** will be admitted in Advanced Diploma in Bioinformatics. The admission will be given to the candidates who fulfill the requisite conditions of eligibility mentioned for the course on first come first served basis.

There is no “detention” system in Distance Education. Students who have failed will be allowed to continue the course of study for the next year.

The following documents must be uploaded along with the Application form. Any lapse in this connection may result in delay in finalization of the Admission and/ or rejection of the application.

#### 4. Rules of Examinations:

- a) All the examinations of Osmania University are held at Hyderabad and/ or such places and on such dates as may be notified and on website.
- b) Applications for permission to appear at an Examination shall be made on the prescribed form along with the necessary certificates and the prescribed fee should be paid through online.
- c) Exam shall be held at the end of the each semester only in the subjects offered during the term. A candidate who has been allowed to appear for the main exams in the concern subjects, but did not appeared or has failed to pass the exam, may be permitted to reappear in the subject at the subsequent exam.
- d) The candidates who have not paid examination fees of Semester and not appeared for both Practical and Theory papers in the First Semester will be promoted to Second Semester and are eligible to write both I and II Semesters examinations (both Theory and Practical's) along with the II semester examinations by paying an amount of Rs. 200/- extra in addition to the Prescribed Examination fee.

- f) The student shall appear for the University exam at the end of each term only in the subjects offered during the term. Such candidates who are unsuccessful, however, may appear in the make-up exam conducted at the end of second term.
- g) A student shall be successfully completing the Course by fulfilling the following requirements

- i. Securing 50% marks in the Internals.
- ii. Securing minimum pass marks for Theory paper is 40% In university Examinations
- iii. Securing 50% marks in practical papers.

**Division is awarded in accordance with the combined aggregate marks secured by him/ her in two semesters.**

- h. There will be University Examinations at the end of each academic year.
- i. The minimum pass marks in each paper is 36% and overall aggregate is 40%.
- j. The students must fill the examination application form as per the instructions and
- k. examination fee has to be paid through online. Examination Hall Tickets will be kept on website.
- l. A press note also will be issued for the information of students. Examination
- m. Dates will be intimated to the students through SMS and also displayed on COE Website.

## **5. Assignments :**

Submission of Assignments is compulsory for the students of Advanced Diploma courses both in first and second Semesters. Each candidate has to submit one assignment (20 / 30 marks) for each paper at the end of each semester before the stipulated date. Candidate who have not submitted the Assignments, their results will not be declared. Assignments should be in hand written only. Assignments on printed/Xerox copy or on typed papers will not be accepted and will not be evaluated at any cost. Assignment question paper will be given/uploaded on in the official website of OUCDE.NET. These Assignments will be evaluated by the faculty and marks secured will be added to the University Examination. This will be applicable to the candidates who have registered for the examinations for the particular year / Semester only. A fee of Rs. 300/- should be paid online and submit proof along with Assignments.

## **6. Medium of Instruction**

The medium of instruction and the Study Material for all the Advanced Diploma courses are only in English Medium.

### **(i) Study Material:**

The Study (Course) material is normally dispatched to the students in one or two installments. The students who take admission in person can collect the material in person from the material / book section of the centre, on the same day by producing the Admission Fee Receipt / ID Card. In respect of the other students, the material will be sent by post depending on the mode of payment of their tuition fee. If the tuition fee is paid in installments the material will also be sent accordingly.

### **(ii) Contact Programme:**

Contact between teachers and the taught will be provided by arranging the Contact-cum counseling classes for a period of Ten days at the end of the academic year / Semester and prior to the Annual / Semester Examinations. The venue of the classes, exact dates and timings of the commencement of contact classes will be intimated to the candidates to their mobile by SMS and will be uploaded on official website. Students should produce their identity card for attending these classes.
