8. **The exam Centre once allotted will not be changed under any circumstances. Exam Centres for (Previous & Final) year are located at HYDERABAD (TWIN CITIES), MAHABUBNAGAR, MEDAK, NALGONDA, NIZAMABAD, SURYAPET, KAMAREDDY, SIDDIPET, TANDUR, SANGAREDDY and VIKARABAD only.**
9. **Candidates will not be allowed to enter the examination hall after (10) ten minutes of the commencement of examination.**
10. Candidates are not allowed to carry printed material / manuscript or any other objectionable material inside the examination hall.
11. Programmable Calculators and Cell Phones are strictly prohibited in the Examination Hall.
